DSF FEES AND CHARGES

Effective from 1 January 2019 to 1 July 2019*

Consultation

(35-45 minutes)

Consultations are \$185 for Non-Members and \$170 for Members. For Health Care Card holders, consultations are \$140 for Non-Members and \$130 for Members. Consultations covering an extra sibling (90 minutes) are \$235 for Non-Members and \$215 for Members. For Health Care Card holders, 90 minute consultations are \$180 for Non-Members and \$170 for Members.

Full Psycho-educational Assessment

(4–5 hours in total, 2 sessions)

The cost of a Full Assessment is currently \$1,250 for Non-Members and \$1,190 for Members. (This cost is split over the two sessions, resulting in a charge of \$625 per session for Non-Members and \$595 for Members). For Health Care Card holders, a Full Assessment is currently \$950 for Non-Members and \$920 for Members. (For each session this is \$475 for Non-Members and \$460 for Members).

Cognitive Assessment

(1-1.5 hours, 1 session only)

The cost of a Cognitive Assessment is currently \$485 for Non-Members and \$460 for Members. For Health Care Card holders, a Cognitive Assessment is currently \$370 for Non-Members and \$350 for Members.

Functional Assessment (Literacy or Numeracy)

(2.5–3 hours, 1 session only)

The cost of a Functional Assessment is \$780 for Non-Members and \$750 for Members. For Health Care Card Holders a Functional Assessment is currently \$590 for Non-Members and \$570 for Members.

Functional Assessment of Literacy and Numeracy (combined)

(3–3.5 hours)

The cost of a combined Functional Assessment of Literacy and Numeracy is \$1025 for Non-Members and \$990 for Members. For Health Care Card Holders a Functional Assessment is currently \$780 for Non-Members and \$745 for Members.

Diagnostic Review Assessment

(1-1.5 hours)

For those individuals that have previously completed an assessment at DSF and require a review of the diagnosis, DSF is now able to offer a Diagnostic Review Assessment. This assessment type is \$195 for Non-Members and \$180 for Members. For Health Care Card holders, a Diagnostic Review Assessment is \$150 for Non-Members and \$140 for Members.

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Speech Pathology Assessment

(2–2.5 hours - Oral or 1.5 hours - Literacy)

Two kinds of Speech Pathology Assessments are available: Oral Language Assessment or Literacy Assessment. The cost of a Speech Pathology Assessment is currently \$495 for Non-Members and \$475 for Members. For Health Care Card holders, an initial Speech Pathology Assessment is currently \$380 for Non-Members and \$370 for Members.

An additional session for either Oral Language or Literacy Assessment is currently \$395 for Non-Members and \$375 for Members. For Health Care Card holders an additional session is currently \$260 for Non-Members and \$250 for Members.

Counselling

(50 minutes)

Counselling sessions are \$165 for Non-Members and \$155 for Members. A Medicare rebate can be claimed for up to 10 counselling sessions with a referral from a GP. (A Health Care Card does not alter the cost of counselling).

Technology Consultation

(45 minutes)

Technology Consultations are \$185 for Non-Members and \$175 for Members. For Health Care Card holders, Technology Consultations are \$140 for Non-Members and \$130 for Members.

Technology Consultations covering specific use cases are \$235 for Non-Members and \$215 for Members. For Health Care Card holders, Technology Consultations covering specific use cases are \$180 for Non-Members and \$170 for Members.

Speech Therapy

(30–60 minutes)

The cost of a speech therapy session is currently \$160. Shorter speech therapy sessions are also available (45 minutes) for \$130/session and (30 minutes) \$80/session.

A Medicare rebate can be claimed for up to 5 speech therapy sessions/year with a referral from your GP. (Having a Health Card does not alter the cost of speech therapy).

*Our aim at DSF is to keep our fees and charges as low as possible. However, in order to respond to rising costs, we review the fees we charge on a regular basis, introducing a revised fees and charges schedule on the 1st January and the 1st of July each year. This may result in the addition of a small increase at these times.

Many private health insurers provide rebates for psychological and speech pathology sevices. Please contact your insurer directly to find out what rebates you are entitled to.
